# Educational Visit

I am very pleased to tell you that we will be going on a class visit to the **Emergency Services Museum in Sheffield on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> February**. ### Reading and Maths Homework

Phonics and Reading is prioritized in Foundation Stage Two, as it opens many other doors for learning. Please ensure your child reads a little every day and continues to revise their letter sounds in their green Sound Book. Don't forget to praise them by writing a comment in their reading diary too. Remember they are working towards their reward certificates, and we will stamp their diary every time they read three times a week. I will also put links to the RWI virtual classroom on DoJo on a regular basis. Children will also bring home a new library book every week. Bring your reading folder every day! Remember rereading the same book/text several times develops fluency and language acquisition. I am also going to put a practical or oral Maths challenge on Dojo every Friday. This doesn't need to be recorded on paper and will always consolidate previous learning. I would be happy to receive any photos by Do Jo of learning at home!

#### Snacks, Water and Milk

We will continue to provide a fruit snack and a carton of milk. If your child would like to bring another snack, it must be a healthy choice and only water should be in school water bottles. We are also trying to reduce the use of plastic packaging, so please send snacks in reusable packaging. This is in line with school policy. Please keep us up to date about any allergies or food intolerances your child may have.

# <u>P.E</u>

Our PE day will continue to be on Wednesday afternoon, and we will also get lots of fresh air and exercise outdoors in our outdoor learning. Please can you ensure that your child has the appropriate PE kit (a yellow T shirt and black shorts). It would also be a good time to buy your child some black school pumps for outdoor PE. If your child has their ears pierced, ideally earrings should be taken out, or if they have recently been pierced we can put some tape over them.
