Considering how classroom teachers and teaching assistants can provide targeted academic support, including how to link structured one-to-one or small group intervention to classroom teaching, is likely to be a key component of an effective Pupil Premium strategy.	1,2	Progress of all children, especially those in receipt of PP, was monitored at the end of each half term.  TA timetables updated following these meetings which has ensured that TAs are delivering targeted, quality interventions to address the main areas of need for each child in receipt of Pupil Premium.  All children in receipt of Pupil Premium have a learning pack in place, regardless of their ability, delivered at least once weekly. Work in the learning Pack is updated regularly to address children's needs.  Afterschool tutoring targeted the needs of pupil premium children in year 6 focussing on catching up on missed learning in reading and maths preparation for secondary school.  The impact of this is that all pupil premium children in year 6 successfully passed their statutory tests.
